

Cardenden Community Council

Notes of Meeting held in Corrie Centre on Thursday 21 June 2018

In Attendance: Two police officers and two members of the public.

Three representatives from Westfield.

The minutes of the May meeting were accepted and agreed.

Matters Arising. None.

Police Matters. There has been 178 calls to the police since the last meeting, with 39 crimes of various categories and 28 detected. Links with social services and housing have been established. Youth disorder in other areas have been dealt with and youth involvement formed with Lochgelly cycle track. Police will be attending various events in the area.

Local Authority Matters. Reports from local councillors were given, which included parking in Station Road and St. Ninian's school. The compostable carrier bags trial has been launched. Walkabouts with council officials have been held in various areas of the village. A section of the playpark at Woodend is unusable and requires attention before the school holidays.

Westfield Site. Three representatives attended to give an update on the Westfield site. Permission in principle has been given to develop the site, but detailed plans are now to be submitted. It is the intension to construct an incinerator to burn waste, which could see up to 500 lorries a day using the Loch Leven road. It is still unclear if Fife Council will use this facility and there is no plans to transport the waste by rail. It is the intension to set up a liaison group.

Community Matters. A new community action plan has been launched. The Beautiful Fife judging will take place on 18 July.

Planning Applications. Noted. An exhibition was held giving details of a proposed council house development on Cardenden Road. Another exhibition was held giving details of a private housing development on Cardenden Road. A flood risk assessment has been requested for the housing development at Woodend.

AOB. New head teachers are to be appointed at Denend School and Lochgelly High School. Post meeting note: Community Council elections will be held in October.
